Future direction of MWBC Inc.

The Committee of Management (COM) sub-committee has looked at the successful actions taken by some other Clubs who were in similar circumstances to our Club [particularly the Torquay Bowling Club]. The lesson from the experiences of these Clubs is that we need to commit our limited resources to a small group of major projects with the potential to have a material impact on the ability of our Club to survive, grow and succeed.

The COM has four such projects and they are the subject of this discussion about our Clubs future. The COM has agreed that each of these projects will be driven by a small group of committed Club Members prepared to provide the time and effort into securing the future of our Club.

In selecting the four projects the COM sought the following impact on the Club:

Achieving a rapid growth in the Social membership of the Club will increase the pool of people using the Club's facilities and will create a pool of potential new bowlers

Establishing a large and active Twilight Bowls competition will allow the Club to access those potential, or current/inactive, bowlers who, for whatever reason, do not wish to [or cannot] play Pennant bowls. It also creates a pool of people who will be users of the Club facilities and some of them may wish to pursue a pathway to Pennant bowls

Creating an electronic database provides a means of communicating regularly with a wide range of people who have been visitors to the Club or who are members of the Club. Such communications would be marketing and promotional in nature.

In our area of the City of Monash there is no logical venue/facility/Club where members of the local community, particularly families, can gather for social time in a safe and friendly environment. Establishing the Club and its facilities as a Community Hub will provide a much-needed facility.

Be aware -Standard Drink

To clarify new drinking laws the following is a definition of a standard drink

Beer -375ml of full strength (4.8% acholol volume is 1.4 standard drinks

375ml of mid-strength (3.5% alcohol volume) is one standard drink

375ml of low strength (Light -2.7% alcohol volume) is .08 of a standard drink

Sherry, Port -60ml (one sherry glass) is .08 of a standard drink

Whisky -30ml (half s sherry glass) of 40% spirit is one standard drink. The shot glasses hold 50ml which is 1.7 standard drinks

Red & White Wine – 100ml equals one standard drink (Red 13% alcohol volume – White 11.5%)

The general rule of thumb is that drinks in the first hour will raise your blood alcohol content to .05 and one standard drink per hour after that will maintain that level. At this point you are over the limit. So, over the first hour, one sherry or port and alight beer should be ok. If you consume a full-strength beer then, to be safe, that is all you should have unless you want to wave the scotch bottle under your nose.

If you get caught driving with a blood alcohol of .05 or more, you will lose your licence and be required to complete a compulsory Drink Driver Program as well as having an interlock device installed in your vehicle on regaining your licence.


