This writer paraphrases those changes, and without diminishing the importance of the detail recorded in the minutes, that they convey as follows; to simplify the language of certain categories of membership for greater clarity and easier understanding, which makes them more easily explained to potential new members. The Club has in recent times made and continues to make deliberate efforts to make itself more attractive and open to a broader sector of the community. The Club is a community based organisation which has for the past 54 years had as its primary focus Lawn Bowls. The new changes will extend the Club's capacity as a communitybased venue will allow more people to play bowls not only competitively as in the past, but for the simple pleasure of recreation and community leisure activity. White, cream, coloured or Registered Club coloured shirt with collar.

White, cream, coloured or registered Club coloured garments including trousers, shorts, dresses, culottes, skirts, slack suits, skirt suits, pedal pushers, jackets, vests, and headwear.

PLEASE NOTE:

It is the responsibility of the President of each Club to ensure all members observe the Bowls Victoria Regulations for Attire, including the Bowls

Australia National Logo Policy, which applies always when playing in Pennant and above Competitions.

IF REGISTERED CLUB SHIRTS IS WORN FOR

PENNANT, ALL MEMBERS OF A SIDE MUST BE ATTIRED IN THE SAME SHIRT.

For practice, neat and respectable casual dress must be worn. Dress is bowls uniform for practice while tournaments or other scheduled events are being played.

WINTER SEASON:

Acceptable dress during winter season (following Anzac Day and until the last Friday in August) is mufti.

IN THE CLUBHOUSE:

Neat and respectable casual dress may be worn. Men must remove hats when entering Clubhouse.


Around the Greens

The Third put in a great bowl of his own making, which was not one of the suggested options, to take shot and win the end for the team. The Skip took the credit for the win. September 8, 1968, crossed the Equator aboard the SS Southern Cross in the Atlantic Ocean off the West Coast



The details of the results are listed in the article, but unfortunately the results were not great. There are 10 teams listed with Mount Waverley winning 4 games. Side 3 saw J.Wood win 24/16, K Hall 24/17, B.Kendrick 21/21 R. Lyons 19/25 defeated Bennettswood 88-79. Side 5 saw M.Jenkins 34/19, F. Tucker 35/17, A McCulloch 31/13 and N.Cottee 26/19 defeated East Malvern 126 - 68. Side 9 saw C. Cakebreak 38/11, J.Thomas 37/17, F.Cook 30/12 defeated Canterbury 98 - 40, and Side 10 saw W. Brown 30/19, K.Brown 16/32, and C. Lambros 30/13 defeated Clayton 76 - 64.



Ten Duty Rink Commandments

Duty Rink Duties are not onerous. Simply they include

- At any given event, a **Duty Rink Team** will be allocated the Duty Rink Duties for the day either by the website or on the Team Board.
- **Duty Rink Team** members must ensure that on arriving at the Club, it is their role that all requirements for play are in place, specifically bins, mats, jacks and flag's.
- Every other playing member should also caste their eye to ensure that Duty requirements are in place ready for the day's play and take steps to rectify any deficiencies.
- Every member has a Duty Rink responsibility whenever they visit the Club.
- Specifically, the **Duty Rink team** must attend to the following tasks at the close of day's play.
 - Collect all corner flags and take down flagpole flags after the completion of the roll of the last bowl of the day
 - Return and lock in place the bowls scoops in the player shelters.
 - Return all bins, mats and jacks to the trolleys and securely lock trolleys in the appropriate sheds.
 - Ensure that heavy jacks from the synthetic green are placed the Match Committee office along with all umpire equipment
 - Turn off the power to the water coolers, lock the covers in place and take the drink cup holders to the Match Committee office.
