### COACHES CORNER

Duties of a Third

A Third is the “Foreman” on the job.

He must have the ability and versatility of a good all-round second, plus plenty of experience and able to read a head.

A good Third should: -

Be cool in a crisis.

Offer accurate advice: -

- (a) When the Skipper asks.
- (b) When the head is changed, and he feels the Skipper may not realise a new opportunity or danger.
  - Support the Skippers choice of shot wholeheartedly and not plant “seeds of doubt” in his mind.
  - Encourage and enthuse his team at his end and pick up their bowls where possible.

- Stay on the green with the game.
- Be able to draw a saving bowl to reduce a damaging situation.
- Be able to play a crucial “big” bowl with a maximum conversion a few times a game.
- Be able to play position bowls or catches, as the Skipper requires.

## REMINDER - ETIQUETTE ON THE GREEN

Bowls is a friendly game. Consideration for others, courtesy and good sportsmanship add charm to a skilful and rewarding sport.

Give full support to all members of your team.

Dress correctly (read and be familiar with the Club’s dress code). Applaud good shots and generally encourage your own players. Play for the Team, not your individual success.

Play the shot you are asked to play by your Skip, without questioning it.

Avoid giving advice to players from the bank.

Understand that the Umpire’s decision is final.

the back wall of the ditch. He dutifully ruled that that even though it was hidden it was live and marked its position with a marker on the bank. The event naturally triggered some lively 'what if etc etc' discussion. The 'experts' at the time reflected on the rules of golf for an answer and resorted, when 'a Golf Ball Goes Down a Burrowing Animal Hole and Disappears? Golf Rule 25-1c states it must be known or virtually certain that the ball is in the
