MWBC MEMBERS COVIDSAFE CHECKLIST

COVID CHECKLIST – Pennant / Social Bowls

- Register arrival via QR code or Sign-in Register. Pennant players will be signed-in via BowlsLink for matches.
- Observe number limits on each green
- Maintain 1.5m social distance
- Wear mask when unable to stay 1.5m apart
- All players to sanitise hands every 6 ends
- Only leads to touch mat and jack and sanitise before using.
- Skips to align jack with foot and to use lifter to retrieve jack from ditch or move mat.
- Mark touchers with spray or liquid chalk only
- Only one home player to update scoreboard
- Sanitise before and after each use of bowls rake / scoop
- Don't touch other players or their bowls
- Don't share pens or other personal equipment
- BYO drinks and refreshments
- Sanitise tap after filling own water bottle from water fountain
- Carpooling not recommended

COVID CHECKLIST – Use of Clubhouse

- Register using QR code when entering Clubhouse
- Sanitise hands when entering Clubhouse
- Observe number limits for each area signs at entry points
- Maintain 1.5m social distance
- Masks to be worn at all times except when actually eating or drinking

Bar:

- Table service only bar staff will take your order and serve you drinks
- Nibbles for personal consumption only no sharing
- Tabs will be run for payment by credit card
- Tables to be cleaned and sanitised by patrons after each
- Cleaning kits available from the bar

Tea & Coffee:

no self-service, you must be served by a designated person

QR Code registration

Like most other bowling clubs and many businesses, we have decided to use a QR code to streamline the recording and electronic record keeping of everyone who visits the Club. If you do not have a smart phone, a friend can log in for you.

The first time you enter the Club you will need to scan the QR code and enter the requested details – your name and phone number. This creates a unique and unidentifiable code for you which means you do not have to re-enter your details on future visits to the Club – you just have to scan the code again as you enter.

To scan the code; use your phone camera to focus on the code square, click the link to the website that appears and complete the requested information. If it **does not** scan, check the settings in your phone to ensure 'Scan QR codes" is switched on.



Club Calendar

President's Message

Reopening — November saw us back on the Greens for practice and heading into December back to competition pennant for a 14-round season. With the Government's announcement on 22 November we saw a further relaxation of the Covid rules. Subsequently no masks are required outdoors (including playing bowls) and larger gatherings are allowed indoors.

The Clubhouse has since reopened for meetings and drinks from the bar. Friday social drinks recommenced on 20 November, exactly 8 months from when last drinks were served. Some 22 members were present. Going forward there will be no need to book ahead but rules will still apply such as registering your name on arrival, no cash and seated service only.

The Club is currently investigating a QR code system which is being recommended by authorities as a means of contact tracing should it be necessary.

The next step for the Club will be to recommence the hire of the Clubhouse for Corporate events and Community Hub activities. We need these activities to begin generating some badly needed revenue. These activities will happen in the lead up to Christmas.

After the Corporate and Hub activities, the COM will then recommence social Club activities which will likely be a dinner for in the new year.

Green and Catering Fees – Due to the shortened bowling season and restriction on the provision of tea/coffee and biscuits, there will be a reduction in the charges for the Green and Catering Fees payable by pennant bowlers. We expect these charges to be invoiced in December.

Tournaments – With the season being disrupted by Covid issues, the COM has decided to cancel all major tournaments for the current bowling season. The Club has a very good reputation in running tournaments and we would not wish to run a sub-standard event for the sake of it. There are also financial implications that affected this decision. Basically the COM would like to see the Club get back to as near as normal for its members rather than a focus on visitors via tournaments.

Handbook – The new Handbook is currently with the printer but the printer has a large backlog so we are unable to be precise as to its availability.

New Uniforms – We expect the new uniform shirts to be delivered shortly and these will distributed to all pennant players and those who have ordered them when received.
