PRESIDENT'S REPORT

February was also a sad month for our Club. We had the passing of our head umpire Ken Chapman on the 7th of February. Ken was an integral member of the Club and was always available to ask about the laws and rules of our sport. He had been a National and International Bowls Umpire over his long association with Bowls. Our deepest condolences go to his family and especially to our club member Sheila Dillon, who was Ken's long-time friend and companion. We also had the passing of club member Peter Reilly, who left us on the 17th of February. He died peacefully at home and our condolences go to his family. Peter was always a gentle and friendly

member who was very well known throughout the bowls community, playing in lots of tournaments and competitions at many clubs around Melbourne. We also lost our former club member Michael Stransky in early February who died of complications with COVID and other underlying issues. He was a member of a club for several years and played a lot of pennant and other tournaments around Melbourne. Peter Reilly, Michael and I played together many times at various bowls clubs, and we enjoyed the sport together. All these great members will be missed.

The Club's negotiations with Monash Council re the renewal of our lease are currently on hold pending the Council's development of a Strategic Plan for bowls within the Monash area. A meeting with the other Monash Bowls Clubs has been held to discuss the Council's strategic direction for our sport. Since the Monash Bowls Forum in December, a draft Discussion Paper has been developed by the Council. We anticipate that this will soon be presented to Council, with a view to then releasing the paper for community consultation. The consultation period typically lasts for 4-6 weeks and as soon as we have the paper, we will present it to the members for discussion.


The Social Deck is in the final stage of technical design and will then proceed to the permit planning stage. We anticipate that the deck will be constructed soon after sorting out the best mechanism for construction and receiving final go-ahead from the relevant authorities. Thank-you to the Steering Committee for all their hard work on reaching this point. With our new deck build underway we would like to renew the appearance of the Clubhouse. This may include modernising the interior e.g. Foyer, improving the outside of the Club and providing furniture and heating for the deck. COM has reopened the Rebuild the Mount fundraising opportunity to provide either a direct donation via a funds transfer to the Club's account or a credit card payment over the bar

or a tax-deductible donation through the Australian Sports Foundation. So far, over \$3500 has been donated and I really appreciate the support that Club members have already shown. The COM are starting to look at opportunities to make these improvements and we will be looking for your help and support as we move forward.

Since the beginning of this year, we are still receiving numerous enquiries for Corporate/Private functions to be held at the Club. We have a number already booked in for March so I would like your help and support to manage all these events and will be calling on you to volunteer and provide your time. I will be providing sheets in the foyer for each event.

The land that the club house sits on was purchased in 1964. The Club also owned land facing onto High Street Road. This were sold in 1967 and the proceeds used to pay for the retaining wall at the back of the clubhouse. The club greens sit on reclaimed land that formed part of the Damper Creek watercourse. The area around Damper Creek would originally have been a valuable source of food for the traditional inhabitants of the area — the Wurundjeri. With a history like that and our modern bar we could well become the Damper Creek Waterhole.

"A good back bowl" = nearly in the ditch


"Could be useful there" = not in the ball park
