Sponsor News

For the third year in a row, we have 'lost' some smaller sponsors, but most of these businesses want us to call again next year, as they would like to continue supporting our Club.

We welcome a new sponsor, Jellis Craig, who through a competitive bidding process, have won the exclusive real estate rights to advertise and sponsor events in 2022/23 and beyond. The outcome of this process will deliver a significant financial boost to the Club through increased guaranteed income, with the opportunity to increase this income further through referred property sales.

Jellis Craig is currently preparing new signage for the Centre Green, 3 shelter sheds and 4 scoreboards and this is expected to be installed by the end of November.
