Clubhouse Repairs

Many of the Monday morning house keeping activities around the Clubhouse and gardens go unseen and unnoticed. The hundreds of hours Graeme Robinson spends identifying and rectifying maintenance and repairs to the Clubhouse and fittings, often occurs before we realise that there is even a problem.

Recently, two of our more persistent problems – the rising damp in the kitchen storeroom and the leaking roof in the rear storeroom, have been rectified. In each case, the rainwater is starting to cause damage to the wooden shelving.

The Club has finally been able to engage a contractor to realign the concrete pathway so that water no longer pools against external wall of the storeroom and now drains to the stormwater pit near the BBQ area.

The leak in the rear storeroom roof has been due to the deterioration of the sealant between the old and new roofing sections since the extension was constructed. The waterproof sealant has now been reinstated and other sections of roof starting to show rust damage, have been treated to extend the life of the steel roof.

Clubhouse Improvement Program

New blinds were installed in the Committee Room, Office and Selectors Room on Friday 24 February (see pic below). The blinds allow good visibility of the greens from inside the Clubhouse with no visibility from the outside looking in – just a reflection of the greens.



The painting crew of Barry Jarred, Richard Horban, Doug Oldfield and Howard Rose worked hard in the weeks prior to paint the pelmets and window frames and Graeme Robinson removed the curtains and brackets and carried out some essential carpentry.

Incidentally, our painters found masking tape attached to the aluminium window frames from the last re-paint of the Selector's Office and mused over whether this was a painter's oversight or a thoughtful gift to future painters!
