PLAYING IN A TEAM

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Much of our competitive bowls is spent playing "fours". This is fundamentally a team game in which everybody has an important role to play.

The lead.

While you may think that the lead 's role is to put two bowls close to the jack, there are three tasks to be completed before a bowl is delivered.

1- Placing the mat. The mat is a tactical tool. It's position is one factor in deciding the length of the end. A lead should always talk to the skip at the start of a game to discuss the position of the mat. At each end the lead, before placing the mat, should always have an eye to the skip to see if any change to the position is required.

Always face the rink number when placing the matthat way you will never place it on the wrong line!!

2- Delivering the jack. The jack is also a tactical tool. Combined with the placing of the mat the position of the jack determines the length of the end. As with the mat the lead should look to the skip to provide guidance on the length to which the jack should be rolled.

Rolling the jack is a skill in itself and requires just as much attention as delivering your bowl. Jack which are rolled outside the rink boundaries are an absolute NO-NO!!

3- Centring the jack. While many skips perform some kind of war-dance to try and centre the jack, it is the lead's responsibility to ensure that it is centred. Stand upright on the mat, look at the number at the other end and ensure that you, the jack and the number are all in one line.

Then you can demonstrate how good a draw bowler you are by putting two bowls within half-a-mat of the jack!!

The second.

A good second is a player with a range of skills. He/she takes the next steps in building a head. This might involve

- Drawing a shot to complement a good start by the lead
- Drawing a shot where the lead has failed
- Playing a weighted shot to push out an opposition bowl
- Playing a position bowl to counter a possible opposition shot
- etc

A common responsibility of the second is to keep the scorecard - and to make sure it's correct!! It is essential that all boxes are filled in, leaving no room for error. A good card should look like this.



At each end the score must be checked with the opposing second.
