On Thursday 27th March the Club played host to students and support staff from some of the region's Special Schools - Glenallen School in Glen Waverley, Croydon SDS and Burwood East SDS.

Special Schools are a very important part of the education system. They cater for students with a wide range of intellectual disabilities, physical disabilities or with severe health impairments. Some students may have complex needs and/or multiple disabilities. Within that range individual schools may have an emphasis on specific student needs.

All schools employ cross-disciplinary teams to plan, implement and evaluate individual student-focused learning programs. Teams may include teachers, physiotherapists, occupational therapists, speech therapists together with other disciplines such as music therapists, nurses, personal care assistants etc. who combine to provide a safe, secure and stimulating learning environment. Part of the programs involves providing students with opportunities to engage with the wider community.

At Mount Waverley we feel very privileged to be able to assist in this journey.

PLAYING IN A TEAM

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES....continued

Role of the Third

As well as encouraging all members of the team, it is most important that you work in close harmony with your skip as together you will finalise the result at the head.

When you arrive at the mat, half the bowls have been played and a situation will be beginning to show. You can be holding shot or shots down.

You must be a versatile player to play a range of shots as directed by the skip

- to draw supplementing a good position
- to draw to position to safeguard a good position
- to play weight to take out an opponent's bowl
- to deliver a full-blooded drive to break up the opponent's position.

When at the head end you must be able to clearly inform the skip of any changes which occur as a result of skip bowls.

You must be able to clearly indicate shot bowls, second/third shots or the position of the jack, as required.

You must ensure that you and your team members stand clear of the head when the opponents have possession of the rink.

It is usual practice for the thirds to measure shots unless there is an alternative arrangement. This should be done in close cooperation with the opposing third. Do not allow any interference from other players. If there is any doubt do not hesitate to call the umpire.

When the measure is complete the second (as scorer) and the skip must be told the result promptly.

You should have a sound knowledge of the laws and etiquette of the game.

Role of the skip

As skip you have overall responsibility for the motivation, encouragement and direction of the team. You should always maintain a positive attitude to the other team members and you must have a communication system which other team members understand. You should also be aware of the strengths and weaknesses of your team when deciding on shots to be played. A positive working relationship with your third is of particular importance.

You should have a good understanding of the tactics of the game, start with a game plan in mind but be able to adjust as the situation develops. This is particularly important when you know your opponent and their potential style of play.(e.g. he's a guy who will always play an upshot, so you make sure the back is covered.) When in possession of the mat and therefore the delivery of the jack, you have the opportunity to adjust your game plan accordingly.

You must be at the head carefully watching as the situation develops to determine appropriate shots to be played.

You cannot skip from the bank!!

Remember to stand clear when the opposition is in possession of the rink.

Like the third, you need to have the ability to play a wide range of shots from a draw shot to a full drive as the position warrants.

You should have a sound knowledge of the laws and etiquette of the game.

Always develop a positive and friendly relationship with your opposing skip as this will flow through to both teams to result in a game played in the best sporting spirit.
